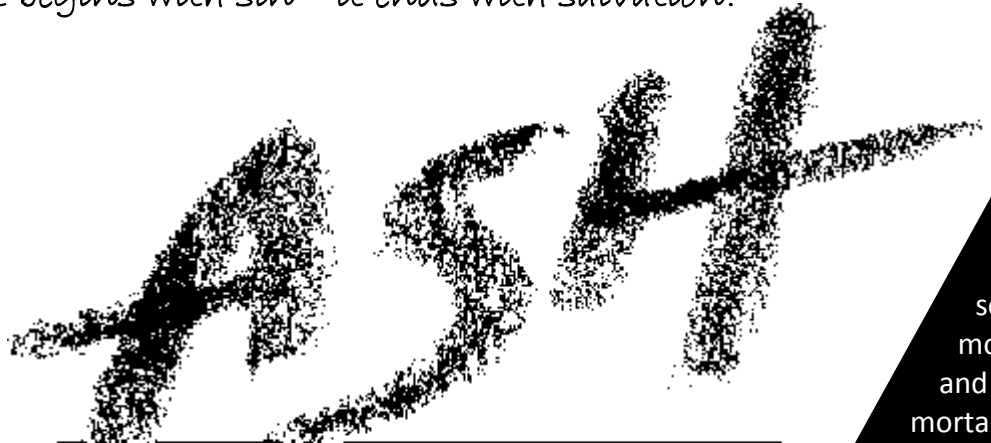

# *A moment with Alicia...*

This past January I experienced something I had never experienced before - surgery. I had carpal tunnel surgery on my right wrist. Never having undergone such a thing before, I didn't really know what to expect. I learned, well rather I re-learned, some things that I thought I would share with you.

First, I don't like to ask for help. I like to be independent, strong, and able to take care of myself and others. Perhaps you feel the same way. However, several days after surgery I found that I still could not grasp a pen, hold a fork, open a container, pick up a towel, type a few words, or do many of the things that I do each and every day. I had to ask for help at home and at work. At first I felt bad, thinking that I was a bother or an imposition to others. Then God reminded me that just as I love to help and serve, others find joy and fulfillment in helping and serving as well. No one minded fixing my plate, opening the bottle of Tylenol, or washing the dishes. I was humbled and honored by the experience of allowing others to help me, and I found that it brought us closer together as I thankfully received these gifts of kindness and help.

Second, I was reminded, again, that God's time line is not mine. I expected that within 48 hours I would be as good as new. After all, I had places to go and things to do. God, on the other hand, knew that my hand needed time and rest in order to heal. I learned that sometimes, when we hurt, we need to stop and allow ourselves time to heal and be restored. We need to get out of the way and let God do what God needs to do in the way and in the time that God knows is best.

Finally, God reminded me that I am not in charge - God is. I am not in control - God is. I really know very little and can do very little without God. I marveled at God's creative abilities as I studied the complexity of tissue and bones that comprise my wrist and my hand. I was awed by the gifts that God bestows upon us as I experienced the talent of the doctor who quickly and skillfully corrected the physical problem. I was amazed at God's healing powers as, over time, God knit back together the tendons in my wrist, eventually restoring strength and movement. I was reminded that I should give God thanks everyday because God is smarter, kinder, and more loving than I can ever hope to be. Thanks be to God!

I pray that you too will take some time this winter to be in awe of the power, majesty, wonder, and love that is our God. May God's peace be with you today and always!

# FINANCE NEWS

## Calvary Account Report as of December 31, 2011

Receipts in the last several weeks of 2011 were **much lighter** than expected for similar time periods in prior years. Past experience had been to expect 40% of annual revenues in the last quarter of the year. Breaking the trend, this did not happen in 2011 as well as 2010. Expenses did continue at pace and shortfalls were covered by withdrawals from our savings from prior year surpluses. The bad news, per our current trend analysis and Budget spending levels, we will hit bottom with no savings or checking balances by mid-year 2012. This issue pertains only to Operating Income and Operating Expenses not to other assets, such as the Endowment Fund, Trustees Reserve Fund etc. for these operational issues.

The Finance Ministry Team is working with the Church Council to hold down expenses to match our current income levels, before our operational liquidity is gone. In addition, we are asking for the support of our congregation. Please prayerfully consider your annual pledge to Calvary. If you have not yet returned your pledge card, we urge you to do so as soon as possible. Perhaps you would consider increasing your pledge to help offset raising operating costs? We each have an opportunity to give back to God a portion of what He has so generously given to us. Together we can make a difference!

## LIBRARY NEWS

We hope you have found the new online library catalog to be helpful when searching for a particular book you would like to check out. (If you haven't tried it yet, have a look at <http://calumc.org/library>.) But what if you don't already know what you're interested in reading? An exciting feature of the online catalog is the ability to rate and review books. The main catalog page has a short list of reviews that have recently been submitted by members of our congregation -- browse through it to see what people have been reading and what they thought of it. At the bottom of the list is a link that says "find more reviews". This will take you to a page where you can search for reviews based on when they were submitted, the kind of book, and how well the reviewer liked it.

When you search or browse the catalog, you will see a row of stars underneath the title and author's name. The number of stars filled in shows you the average rating our readers have given that book. If you click on the title of a book, you will go to the book's detail page. If there are any reviews of the book, there will be a "reviews" tab at the bottom next to the "details", "marc", and "suggestions" tabs.

Of course, we need your help to make the most of this feature. When you've read something, let others know what you thought of it. You can give a book a rating in just a few seconds. First find the book and go to its detail page. Under the title and author's name on the detail page you will see a row of stars. Click on a star to contribute your rating. That's it! If you'd like to share your opinions in detail, click on the link next to the stars that says "write a review". A form will appear where you can write your review, assign a rating, designate a category, and attach your name. (If you'd rather not give your name, just use "Anonymous".) Then click the save button at the bottom. Your review will be posted as soon as the library staff has had a quick look at it.

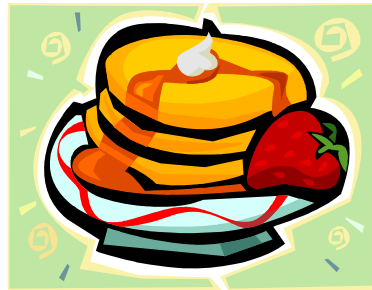

# MISSIONS

Lenten Offerings provide an opportunity for the Mission Team to highlight four mission projects. The 2012 Lenten Offerings will be given to the following projects:

**Light House Shelter:** It is the only emergency shelter in the City of Annapolis. The facility provides Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, a Resource and Support Center and a Chronically Homeless Day Center. Calvary has had a covenant relationship with the Light House Shelter since its' beginning.

**Appalachia Service Project:** This is an ongoing project that Calvary has been involved with for several years. With the motto, Warmer, Safer, Dryer, there is always work to be done. A mission team will be returning to West Virginia in the fall to continue helping with home repairs.

**Guatemala:** Funds are used to support Medical and Spiritual Training of Village volunteers, support Clean Well Water, medical supplies and leadership training. There is a staff of just thirty people and some are just part-time, so much is needed. A small group of volunteers from Calvary travel to Guatemala each year to help.

**Gleaning:** This is the Biblical practice of gathering crops that would otherwise be left to rot in the fields. Volunteers harvest the fruits and vegetables, which are shipped and then given to the poor and hungry. This is a caring way to bring nutrition to those in need.

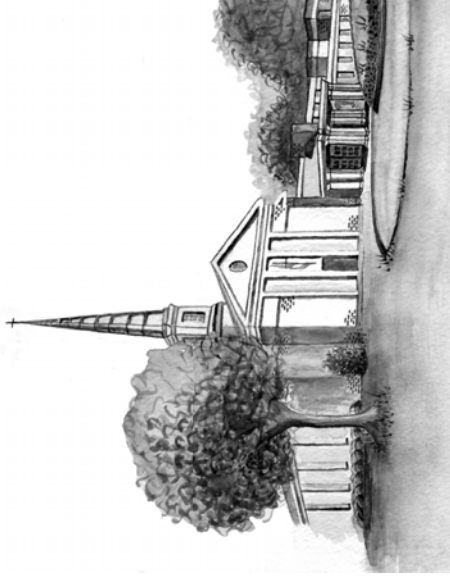
